Enjoy a relaxing early summer break on the English Riviera staying at Babbacombe Bay, a charming resort which enjoys a mild climate and stunning coastal views. Babbacombe boasts a number of great tourist attractions to visit including the Cliff Railway, Model Village and Bygones Museum all only a short walk away. The Theatre is just up the road, Babbacombe itself is full of lovely shops, restaurants and cafés and St. Marychurch pedestrianised shopping precinct is only a few hundred yards away, so there's plenty to do while you're here. All rooms are en-suite with hospitality tray and hairdryer there is no lift but 10 rooms are on the ground floor with a normal flight of stairs to the first floor, evening entertainment is provided by the hotel.

Package itinerary

TUESDAY We make an early morning departure from Boston to travel to the hotel with suitable refreshment stops along the way.

FULL DAY Mid morning the coach will take you to Exmouth Marina to board Stuart Line Cruise's for a 1½ hour 6 mile circular journey, the best way to explore the Exe Estuary and surrounding areas, on calm-assured waters suitable for everyone. Re boarding the coach for a short journey to World of Country Life a magical trip to days gone by, including a museum of farming and an extensive vintage vehicle collection returning back to the hotel by late afternoon.

FULL DAY To the historic, maritime city of Plymouth, famous for Sir Francis Drake, who apparently finished a



game of bowls on Plymouth Hoe, before heading out to sea and defeating the Spanish Armada. Returning on a picturesque journey through the heart of the Dartmoor National Park, famous for its ponies and stunning scenery.

FULL DAY to explore the resort which has a pretty promenade with stunning coastal views across the bay, model village, Bygones Museum, a plentiful supply of independent shops and a pedestrianised shopping precinct. There is also a Cliff Railway (small charge) down to Oddicombe Beach which offers amazing views over Lyme Bay and frequent buses operate into Torquay.

SATURDAY We bid a fond farewell to our hosts, departing the hotel after breakfast making the homeward journey back to Lincolnshire with suitable comfort stops en- route.
