THURSDAY With everyone on board we make our way to the hotel with suitable lunch and refreshment stops en-route.

INCLUDED EXCURSIONS:

FULL DAY TOUR To the Blaenavon World Heritage Site where you can experience life as it was for the coal miners and ironworkers.

Explore the many footpaths through the industrial landscape including the Big Pit, the ironworks, workers cottages, quarry, furnace, heritage town and heritage railway. Comfortable footwear recommended. Entrance is mostly free but there is a small entrance charge for some attractions.

FULL DAY TOUR Full day coach tour through the stunning scenery of the Forest of Dean and Wye Valley. A beautiful landscape of dramatic limestone gorges, colourful ancient woodlands of red, gold and yellow hues and plateaux of old red sandstone.

SUNDAY Returning your cases to the coach after breakfast we start the journey homewards but first calling in at Cheltenham for an enjoyable one way trip on the Gloucester Heritage Railway, a gentle ride through the glorious Cotswold countryside with picture postcard villages and wonderful scenery. This may be a steam train but this cannot be guaranteed. The coach will then meet you at Toddington to continue your journey on to the quaint village of Broadway, which boasts a plentiful supply of ancient honey coloured cottages and charming tea rooms where you can get lunch before making the journey homewards.
